Upcoming independent music stars Maps & Atlases will bring their unique music style to Raue Center's Lucy's Café stage at 8 p.m. Friday, May 13.

Coming off the release of their first full-length album, "Perch Patchwork," Maps & Atlases has recently been compared to indie music superstars TV On The Radio and Deerhoof, as well as music legend Prince.

The new album is a departure from previous release's acoustic sound calling more on horns, strings, assorted percussions and even toy instruments to give a more layered, complex and interesting feel to the album.
