Turk is new Raue Center board president

Turk is taking over for Dorion-Gray, who served as board president for three years and is credited with helping Raue Center weather the recession while many community theaters began to fail.

"We have a city that supports us as best they can," Dorion-Gray said.

"But we need the community to continue to support us."

The Raue Center is celebrating its 10th anniversary this season, and Turk said he is excited about taking the reins at this point in its history.

"We're turning a corner," said Turk. "And this year is about celebrating and giving back to the community that helped us get there."

The Raue's lineup for this anniversary season includes a Dennis Tufano performance for opening night on Sept. 18, as well as legendary folk singer Arlo Guthrie, Steinway prodigies Danny Wright and Emily Bear, and the continuation of Lucy's Café.

The nonprofit Raue Center's board of directors also includes Jeffrey Keck, vice president; Chuck Stevens, treasurer; and Walter Packard, secretary. New board members are John Jacobson, Jack Minsley and Tim Paul.

Originally opened in 1929 as the El Tovar, the Raue Center is the product of a multi-million dollar renovation. The state-of-the-art performing and visual arts center at 26 N. Williams St., Crystal Lake, offers professional touring attractions, programs for children and families, and a home for regional artists.
